

BYLAW NO. 1517-A
of the
TOWN OF PINCHER CREEK

A BYLAW OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF THE TOWN OF
PINCHER CREEK, IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, FOR
THE PURPOSE OF AMENDING BYLAW #1517,
ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS FOR FIRE AND
AMBULANCE SERVICES IN THE TOWN OF PINCHER CREEK.

WHEREAS Section 7(a) of the *Municipal Government Act, Chapter M-26.1, R.S.A., 1994 and amendments thereto*, provides that a Council of a Municipality may pass bylaws for the safety, health and welfare of people and the protection of people and property;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Pincher Creek hereby enacts as follows:

1. That Bylaw #1517 be amended as follows

a. Under "Definitions", add the following:

"o. Fireworks means fireworks as defined in the Alberta Fire Code.

p. High Hazard Fireworks means high hazard fireworks as defined in the Alberta Fire Code."

q. Low Hazard Fireworks means low hazard fireworks as defined in the Alberta Fire Code."

b. Add the following new clause:

"PROHIBITIONS - FIREWORKS

47. No person shall offer for sale, purchase or ignite any low hazard fireworks within the corporate limits of the Town of Pincher Creek.

48. No person shall ignite any of the following without a permit issued by the Fire Chief or his/her designate:

- (a) Open air fire**
- (b) High hazard fireworks**
- (c) A fire within a fire pit**

49. Any permit issued for the ignition of High Hazard Fireworks shall only be issued to an individual who holds a valid "Fireworks Supervisors Certification" from Industry Canada.

50. All applicable provisions of the Alberta Fire Code related to the ignition and discharge of High Hazard Fireworks shall be considered part of this bylaw.

51. The Fire Chief or his/her designate shall retain the right to place any conditions, upon a permit issued for the ignition of High Hazard Fireworks, that he/she deems reasonable to ensure that concerns for life and property safety are addressed.
52. The Fire Chief or his/her designate may cancel any permit issued for the ignition of High Hazard Fireworks in the interests of life and property safety."


TRANSITIONAL CLAUSE

2. Bylaw #1364-A and amendments thereto are hereby repealed.

EFFECTIVE DATE


3. This bylaw comes into force and effect upon final reading thereof.
