Hello all,

The quote "the greatness of a community is most accurately measured by the compassionate actions of its members" from Corretta Scott King draws out the importance of our individual and collective efforts in building a welcoming and inclusive community. As we celebrated the work of our volunteers this spring, I am filled with gratitude that I live in a place that has demonstrated, repeatedly, its enthusiastic capacity to build community. We are a community that shows up. We may not always agree on the best path, or specific needs and priorities, but the passion and commitment to improving and growing our home is shared between us. Thank you for you work, time, and talents.

A couple of public hearings are coming up on Tuesday, May 23<sup>rd</sup>: a public hearing on the Clean Energy Improvement Bylaw and a proposed land use amendment enabling medical and dental office developments in the highway commercial land use district. The Clean Energy Improvement Bylaw develops a program whereby residents may apply to have a portion of the cost of energy improvements to their residence paid off via their tax bill. The purpose of the program is to support improved energy efficiency in homes and is advanced by the Town and the MD's Energy Management Project. The proposed Land Use Bylaw amendment considers the use category 'Medical and Dental Office' as desirable in the highway and commercial district. The proposed change is aligned with the Community Economic Development Strategy in viewing the economic growth potential of the health and wellness sector.

I continue to represent our community at a table drawn together in developing a regional Memorandum of Understanding with the Blood Tribe and Kainai Council. Our goal is to develop formal and informal methods and relationships between our Councils and communities to improve and reconstitute the connection between Blackfoot people and non-indigenous folks. After each meeting, I am humbled and impressed by the

dedication and commitment of those around the table and encouraged by a vision of better relations in Treaty 7 territory.

Finally, a closing thank-you to everyone who volunteers and holds dear the best interest of our community to heart. Sometimes we disagree on those interests, yet I know that everyone who volunteers and works to support the wide range of amenities and community services we have is guided by desires of a thriving community. At a recent conference, through conversation with other elected officials, I was reminded of how much we have for a community of our size. We 'punch above our weight' for a small town, it is our strength. But it also means we will have conflicts over the best use of resources and how to maintain the level of service we have. This is the challenge of living together and holding differing visions of what makes for a thriving community. Let's keep engaging with one another and the democratic processes of municipal government to ensure the vitality and growth of this community we all care about.

#### **Public Works Week 2023**

This year's National Public Works Week is May 21st -27<sup>th</sup>, 2023. There are more than 29,000 members across the U.S. and Canada, and this week is used as an opportunity to recognize the hard work of our Public Works team and educate the public on how Public Works affects everyone's daily lives. The efforts of Public Works often goes unnoticed because everything is operating as expected in your life. Water is available when the tap is turned on, toilets flush, and garbage cans are returned empty. There is often a lot of planning and obstacles our small team faces to ensure these everyday conveniences are not disrupted.

The Town's Public Works team, also referred to as the Operations Department, maintains 168 hydrants, 45km of water mains, 14km of storm mains, and 37km of sanitary sewer mains (along with the 468 manholes that go with it.) The Operations Department has a range of backgrounds and experience with the Town ranging from 8 months to 21 years. The Town of Pincher Creek Operations Department consists of a Director (Alexa), Manager (Cory), Coordinators (Jim & Phil), an Asset Management Coordinator (Lukas), Water Treatment Plant Operators (Darcy & Dane), Facility Maintenance (Blake), Maintenance Workers (Brad, Michael, and Ashley), and an Administrative Assistant (Lindsey). Together, we strive to ensure the Public Works needs of the community are addressed in an efficient manner so everyone can go about their normal lives.


